Shortt said: "We are urging everyone to write to their MPs because of the uncertainty created by PM Rishi Sunak (right) and Chancellor Jeremy Hunt over the future of the tri-



ple lock. We are asking MP's to vote to keep the measure which ensures that the state pension rises in line with whichever is highest - inflation, average earnings or 2.5%. If reinstated next spring it would give us a 10% increase, which is desperately needed to try and offset the spiralling cost of living. The suspension of the triple lock for 2022 was not necessary and the 3.1% set last September was quickly overtaken by inflation. By the time pensioners received their rise last April the meagre increase was quickly swallowed up by huge hikes in energy and other bills. Older people spend a larger percentage of their fixed income on energy and therefore have to cut spending on other essentials such as food. These decisions are critical to the health and well-being of older people, especially those with ill health and disabilities."
